<u>Mine Kühn</u> is a medical sociologist and social demographer with a specialization in health inequalities and family dynamics. She holds the position of Assistant Professor in the Department of Sociology of Tilburg University. Prior to this, she was a Research Scientist at the Max Planck Institute for Demographic Research (MPIDR) in Rostock, Germany, and served as the Deputy Head of the Laboratory of Population Health. Her research primarily concerns how health, mortality, and well-being are associated with family dynamics, including aspects such as parenting, separation, and widowhood as well as re-partnering. A primary theme of her work has been to examine health trajectories of single parents and their children. She is also interested in analyzing the association between maternal labor market participation and well-being. Other topics of her research include gender differences in health and mortality, gender role attitudes, or health differences in East and West Germany.

Anna Oksuzyan. I hold a Medical Doctor degree from the Yerevan State Medical University, Master of Public Health from the American University of Armenia, and a PhD in Health Sciences from the University of Southern Denmark (SDU), Odense. I am a Professor of Demography and Health at the School of Public Health, Bielefeld University. Before joining the faculty at Bielefeld University, I led an independent Max Planck Research Group "Gender Gaps in Health and Survival" at the MPIDR, Rostock.

My research agenda is at the intersection of social epidemiology, gerontology, and health demography/population health, with a broad focus on inequalities in health associated with gender, aging, family structures, and international migration. A consistent theme running through my academic career has been the investigation of gender differences in health and survival, predominantly at older ages. Currently,



my PhD student at Bielefeld University and I are working to extend this research strand to examine the health of same-sex couples. In autumn, I was awarded the European Research Council (ERC) Consolidator Grant (CoG). This project will investigate the effects of passive commuting – regularly recurring travel between home and work by a motorized vehicle or public transportation – on the health and well-being of commuters, their partners, and children and whether commuting's health impacts are socially patterned. In all my projects I use Nordic registers and multi-country longitudinal national survey data.
